August 2020 Council Report

Laurel Hofeldt, Director of Finance and Data

- 1) Action Items in Progress / Pending
 - a. June month-end and 2019-2020 fiscal year reporting is still in progress. We ended the year as follows:
 - i. Receipts were (\$86,712) or 5.1% below budget
 - ii. Expenses were (\$46,410) or 2.7% below budget
 - iii. Net Deficit was (\$40,303) or 2.4% below budget
 - b. July month-end closing and reporting is pending. Preliminary numbers indicate that July offering is \sim (\$5,600) or 6% below budget.
- 2) Action Items Completed
 - a. Budget 101 Q&A session was held via Zoom on August 12th as a precursor to the Annual Meeting. Those in attendance submitted questions in advance and were given a detailed presentation of the proposed operating budget for the 2020-2021 fiscal year. Good conversation and questions from our most "numbersfocused" members!
 - b. A streamlined presentation of the proposed operating budget is complete and ready for discussion this Sunday at the Annual Meeting.

A quorum of 100 is needed to vote on the budget and lay leadership nominations.

<u>Small Groups update for September:</u> I am currently working behind the scenes on getting small groups for our September sermon series on "40 days of Community". We have almost all facilitators coming back to be a part of zoom small groups again. We are gaining 2 new facilitators and bumping up our group size to 15.

<u>GriefShare:</u> RLC will be hosting 2 "Surviving the Holidays" 2-hour sessions on November 7th and December 5. I will be leading these. This session is open to the community; however, we will follow guidelines in place for the number of people allowed with Social Distancing.

<u>Summer Worship volunteers:</u> We are gearing up for our LIVE Worship service on August 23rd followed by our Annual Meeting. We are using our staff and council as our volunteers for this service. Depending on how this goes we will move forward with Volunteer Worship needs in September. Stay tuned!

<u>Care Team Memorial Service August 17:</u> every year the Care team has worked with Pastor Rolf to have a time of "remembrance" for all those we lost in the past year. Many of these people had Care Team members serving them. This gives the Care Team members a time to be together and hold a service of remembrance. This year we will be doing this in a Covid friendly way at RLC on the grounds outside. Connie and her team are providing box lunches for the team and people will be bringing their own chairs.

Donut and Coffee deliveries this summer. This Covid 19 ministry has reached out to 12 care facilities that our members are living in and serving over 350 employees. August 6th was our last delivery for now. Each facility has now received this gift of kindness 2 times.

Mini Dramas for Worship series "40 Days of Community": For the purpose of adding a new element to Worship this fall I have been working on 3 minute dramas that will be recorded with RLC volunteers. These will be shown during the 6 weeks online during the Worship Service.

<u>M&O team</u>: I will now become a staff presence on this team to be a conduit to the staff. I also will serve on this team to help with our volunteers in these areas.

ONAM: I will now become a staff presence at this group to help with the Volunteer element and encourage projects that will could come out of this group.
