- 1) Action Items in Progress / Pending
 - a. 2019-2020 Budget draft #3 is being presented for discussion and approval at the June Council meeting.
 - b. Gift Planning Services, LLP has been at RLC to conduct initial meetings with 10 donors. Follow-up meetings with these donors will be completed in June and July. Tamara Fanjoy is scheduled to present Gift Planning Services information at the October 24 CCC meeting.
- 2) Action Items Completed:
 - a. May Month-End Summary and Statement of Operations are attached.
 - i. General Offering year-to-date is \$41,144 higher than last fiscal year-to-date. pRAISE RLC brought in \$72,000 in additional offering. Expenses year-to-date are \$54,567 below budget.
 - ii. Actual net operating surplus of \$30,995 is \$23,662 greater than our budgeted net surplus of \$7,333, meaning we are \$23,662 above our budgeted position at the end of May.
 - b. pRAISE RLC! Spring Fundraiser Recap May 19-22, 2019

Results:

- \$19,500 received in matching gifts
- \$13,350 of these matching gifts were used
- \$58,662 in donations received
- **\$72,012 total for pRAISE RLC!**
- **19% came from matching gifts; 81% came from donations;** last year approximately 40% (\$30,000) came from matching and 60% (\$45,000) from donations
- 247 donors gave an average of \$307; in 2018 for pRAISE 75 - 291 donors gave an average of \$258.

Hello all, the youth and family team met on Sunday, June 9 at 8:45 at RLC. Unfortunately, it was Michael Jordan's last meeting, he will be missed. The next meeting will be held some time in the fall of 2019. The search for MJ's successor's successor is ongoing, with no major developments to report.

MJ reported on the budget, the highlights of which included the current operating budget, that there is \$1,000 less for 2019-20 due to a hospitality transfer, and that all restricted and designated funds have a zero or positive balance. 10 summer scholarships totaling \$2,082 have been granted, not including Slovakia.

This summer's activities include:

- 1) Camp Hiawatha (47 kids, 6 adults);
- 2) Slovakia (21 kids, 6 adults and MJ);
- 3) Summer festival (8 kids, MJ, TH);
- 4) Summer of service (41 kids, 14 adults, AM);
- 5) Young adult boundary waters (7 adults, MJ);
- 6) Boundary waters (6 kids, MJ).

Other highlights include a \$12,584.09 net from the garage sale. MJ also noted there are 2 special appeals requests for the June 20 council meeting, one for Great Lakes Scrip and one for Invest in our youth, each of which is intended to increase revenue from current levels. Both seem like good ideas. Unfortunately, I will not be attending the June 20 meeting due to graduation party prep.

Request #1: Great Lakes Scrip

Scrip fundraising is a no-selling program that allows families to raise money for their non-profit organization. Scrip is just another way to pay for everyday purchases using gift cards in place of cash, checks, and credit cards. You purchase gift cards from your organization at face value, and your coordinator orders those cards from Great Lakes Scrip Center at a reduced price. The difference is an instant rebate for your organization. It's really that simple! When you use scrip gift cards at your favorite retailers, you're fundraising while you shop. Great Lakes Scrip Center offers over 400 of the country's biggest brands, including grocery, department stores, gas stations, restaurants, hotels, home improvement, and more. You can watch the video, *What is Scrip?* for more info (<https://youtu.be/bf8NPhBwNxc>)

Purpose: To help children and youth (birth – grade 12) attending RLC's summer trips offset their trip costs by selling gift cards. We have increased the scope of this fundraiser to include all families, which will help increase awareness and participation in the program. In addition, families with younger children can start raising funds to increase the amount they have available to offset their trip costs.

Use of Funds: Gift cards sold by a family will have 10% of their rebate go into Camp Scholarships (#34110) to pay for administrative fees (shipping, envelopes, bags, etc.) as well as to increase the scholarship fund. The remaining 90% will be shared with the family to be applied towards RLC's summer trips. Gift cards purchased directly through RLC and not via a family member will have 100% of the rebate go into the Camp Scholarship fund.

Fundraising Goal: The hope of this fundraiser is to have it be ongoing throughout the entire year. Seeing an increase in participation from the entire congregation is our overall goal. This past year, we had 26 families participate raising \$3,300 in rebates. We had about a dozen congregational members purchase gift cards as well over the course of this past year. We would like to involve more of the congregation in this fundraiser this year so that people start using Scrip Gift Cards to make their everyday purchases while simultaneously supporting RLC Youth. Also, we moved to ACH Payment through RLC's checking account this past year. This has allowed for faster processing of orders, and families can now order and pay for gift cards online. This has greatly increased the participation from several families as well

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increasing the overall rebates earned. We are exploring ways to best offer this to the entire congregation. Our goal is to raise over \$4,000 in rebates this year. As mentioned above under **Use of Funds**, the rebates not shared with families will go into the Camp Scholarship account (#34110) including those in excess of our \$4,000 rebate goal, thus continuing to support youth going on summer trips regardless of financial need.

Timeline: As mentioned above, we plan for this to be ongoing throughout the entire year. Families would be able to sell and purchase gift cards at any time to continue raising funds. Having the CYF Corner Desk in the Commons has worked well, and will only grow participation with our continued presence. We continue to be stationed there on Sundays to collect payment, deliver gift cards, and sell gift cards to the general congregation during the 10:10 hour. As such, in June of each year, another special appeals request will be made to seek council approval for the upcoming year. Specific timeline and space usage proposals are as follows:

September 8 – CYF Desk returns to Commons

September/October – Parent Informational Meetings to explain Scrip.

Include information on the fundraiser in Update, Eblast, and Table

November/December – Sharing Tree Partnership: Sell gift cards in the Commons in connection with the Sharing Tree (assuming approval for the Sharing Tree).

May 18 – Conclude sales on Sundays. Families can continue to purchase gift cards over the summer, but we will not have a specific table set-up to purchase gift cards. I ask that this deadline be flexible. If we see an increase in participation from congregational members and they will continue purchasing gift cards throughout the summer, I ask that we continue to keep the table.

Request #2: Invest in Our Youth

Summer programming through RLC has a large impact on our youth and families. We rely on generosity, prayers, and support from the congregation to help send every youth that wants to go on these trips. With the success of our envelope fundraising campaign has had over these past three years, we look to continue seeking support that way from our congregation towards youth summer trips. We had 150 envelopes in the commons. Individuals were invited to take 1, 2, or more of them and place their donation inside for the amount listed on that envelope. If all 150 envelopes are filled, we will have over \$11,000 going towards offsetting the costs of our summer trips. We also had a few members donate online through our giving portal.

Purpose: To help Youth and Families attending RLC's summer trips offset their trip costs as well as increasing our scholarship fund. These trips would potentially include (Camp Hiawatha, Youth Mission Trips, Summer of Service, and BWCA).

Use of Funds: The proceeds from Invest in our Youth will be used in the following ways: 10% of the net proceeds will go into the Camp Scholarship account (#34110) to continue supporting those going on RLC's summer trips regardless of financial need. The remaining 90% of the proceeds is then given as a scholarship divided equally among all of the participants who are registered for an RLC summer trip in 2020.

Fundraising Goal: With Invest in Our Youth, we ask for a pure donation from members to support those going on a summer trip. Our fundraising goal will be \$11,325. This specific number comes from how we want to do this fundraiser. By using the Children, Youth, and Family Corner in the Commons, we will be hanging 150 envelopes each with its own number (1 – 150). We will then be asking congregants to place their donation inside the envelope equal to the number on the envelope (so the first envelope will have a \$1 donation, and the final envelope will have a \$150 donation). Filling all envelopes by the end of this fundraiser will result in a total of \$11,325 being raised. We raised \$13,824 through this campaign last year.

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Timeline: We intend to do this fundraiser each year to help support all youth going on summer trips.

February 2 – Summer trip registration forms are due.

Leading up to this registration deadline and for the week following, we will be asking youth who register to write a short thank you note that will be put in the 150 Invest in Our Youth envelopes

February 9 – Youth led worship services at 9 & 11 AM

Unveiling of the Invest in Our Youth envelopes in the CYF Corner.

February 23 – Final day of the Invest in Our Youth fundraiser.

August 2020 – We will be hosting a “Summer Celebration Service” to highlight the summer trips and thank everyone in the congregation for their support. All will be invited. This has been a great way for members to learn more about what our children and youth are learning and doing over the summers through RLC.
