## WHY ADVENT

I read an interesting article the other day that put Christians into different groups. The writer of this article stated it this way:

There are those who can be called Christmas Christians. For these Christians, the most important thing about their Christian faith is believing that the Baby Jesus is our Immanuel – God with us. As Christmas draws near, they are eager to welcome the Christ Child, to sing his praises and announce his presence by singing, “Joy to the World.”

There are then other Christians who could be called Lenten Christians. Lenten Christians see the need for a savior in a world where there is sin and guilt. They are drawn to the cross as the place where they go to receive forgiveness, hope and grace.

Then there are Pentecost Christians who are on fire with the Holy Spirit. They live out their faith in using their spiritual gifts, offering witness and testimony of the power of the Holy Spirit.

And then there are Advent Christians who believe that Christ came into the world; and, yet, sing “Oh Come, Oh, Come, Emmanuel.” They believe that in Christ the kingdom of God has dawned, but still eagerly pray for his “kingdom come.” Theirs is a faith of exile, longing, watchfulness and waiting.

Personally, I have found Advent to be a special time. As the year is winding up and the

## SEASONS OF CHANGE

For everything there is a season and a time for every purpose under heaven, Ecclesiastes 3:1

There are layers of wisdom in this scripture, from the literal observation of the changes in the seasons of God's creation, to the seasons of our lives. As I am writing this, there are still some lingering crimson leaves on the trees. They are the last evidence of the fleeting fall of 2018.

The simple, but profound metaphors that flow from this scripture have inspired everything from songs and poetry, to more pragmatic applications. Everything about our lives, every relationship and organization goes through changes akin to the seasons. This is abundantly true of Roseville Lutheran Church.

As we have continued to create and implement our strategic plan, we have considered each aspect of our ministry through the lenses of Explore, Launch, Sustain and Release. Much like the seasons, these categories acknowledge that RLC is a living system. Change is inevitable and continuous. We can't stop change, but we can understand it, strive to discern God's will, and adapt with wisdom and humility.

In many ways, Roseville Lutheran Church is experiencing a Spring-like time of regeneration. Everywhere I look I see members exploring new initiatives and recommitting to bedrock commitments. Through it all, we are guided by our mission to Love God and to Love our neighbors, near and far.

We are responding to long deferred campus maintenance issues. Thanks to the love and generosity of Roy and Blythe Thompson, we have new roofs throughout our campus. Guided by our staff and the Campus Improvements Task Force, that work was successfully completed under our initial budget.



There is enough money left to tear out the ceilings in the Activity Center, clean any mold or mildew caused by the past leaks, and install new acoustical ceiling tile. This will, in turn, allow the installation of new lighting and a grant-funded sound system that have been waiting for the roof to be repaired.

We will soon take advantage of incentive financing and complete the conversion of all our lighting to LED, including the replacement of many fixtures. This will save us over \$1,000 in monthly energy cost, and permanently reduce our carbon footprint.

Finally, thanks to everyone who planned and participated in our recent One Worship service. There was such wonderful energy, great music, preaching and what a big cast for Story time! While Laurel Hofeldt and her staff are still compiling the information, we do know that so far, we have received 40% more Commitment Cards than last year. If you haven't filled out your card yet, please do so soon. It helps everything we do together. Don't worry about the winter, its spring at RLC.


# FINANCE OFFICE

Over 95% of RLC's day-to-day ministry is funded by your financial gifts. Thank you for your generosity!

Offering is \$25,995 less than we had budgeted as of October 31, 2018. Total year-to-date expenses exceed receipts by \$56,640. The budgeted year-to-date deficit is \$50,430, meaning we are \$6,209 below our budgeted position at the end of October. 


## INVEST IN OUR YOUTH

Here's what's happening

This summer, 21 youth and 7 adult leaders from Roseville Lutheran will embark on a life-changing experience to our partner congregation in Martin, Slovakia. During our week there, we will join the Slovak high school students in serving and learning together. We are excited about this opportunity to grow this partnership in new ways since RLC's first Builder's Group opened the doors to this opportunity in 2003. The motto of the Builder's Group has been "Renovating Rooms – Renovating Lives." For most of our members that have gone to Slovakia it is their own lives that have been changed more through these experiences. As youth and families, we eagerly anticipate our chance to develop lasting friendships while still deepening these established relationships that have been fostered for over 15 years!

Our youth will spend their week in Martin living our mission of "Love God. Love your neighbor" in a completely new way. Each day we will continue classroom renovations alongside the students there. In addition, we will have the opportunity to assist the school's own service partnerships within the community. They work closely with an orphanage in a neighboring town as well as the gypsy slums. We will spend several afternoons with these two groups and focus on playing and teaching the children all while sharing the compassion and love of Jesus. Our youth will be challenged to see their neighbor in all of the people we meet, and our youth will discover new ways that each of them can individually follow God's call to love all of these people. This week of service will leave our youth changed for the rest of their lives, and the memories and friendships will make a lasting impression as our eyes and hearts are opened to how God is doing miraculous work all across the world through each of us that are willing to follow the call.

There is a significant financial cost for our youth going on this summer service learning trip – \$3,200 per participant. To assist our youth financially in their endeavor to serve in new ways, we will once again hang red envelopes in our commons during the month of February. The sign above those envelopes will once again read Invest in Our Youth. This year, I am not asking you to only invest in our youth who are going on this service learning trip. With each investment you make, you are also investing in all the youth we will meet in Slovakia. Not only will your investment aid in sending our 21 youth, but your investment will also go



towards building deeper partnerships in Christ with the over 50 high school youth we will be serving alongside. As witnessed from our previous youth trip to Slovakia in 2016, these friendships have turned into lasting relationships for our youth and adult leaders that have shaped all of us into one community united by God's grace.

When those envelopes go up in February, I invite you to seize this opportunity to spread a generosity that will be contagious by investing in our youth in a way that will bear much fruit for years to come. Through your generous partnership, we will be able to help our youth focus more on preparing their hearts and minds for service. All of those that contribute towards the service learning trip will be invited to our Slovakia banquet on July 14 so that you can hear and see the impact of this trip.

As each of these youth was confirmed, we asked them to consider what it means to lead a Christian life for the rest of their lives. While this trip may only be one week of service, it is laying a firm foundation and understanding in all of them that this work must continue long into the future as part of our call as disciples of Christ.

With your continued prayers and support, we can make this a reality for our youth and the youth in Martin.

**January 19 at 10:00 am**


You might think the story of Harriet Beecher Stowe has been told. We've been there. We've done that. Local author Nancy Koester, however, respectfully disagrees.

*Being Christ in Our Community*

Formed in 2016, the Our Neighbors and Me committee seeks to connect members of Roseville Lutheran with resources that deepen our understanding of the diverse communities that reside within the Roseville and Falcon Heights area. The acronym ONAM (Our Neighbors and Me) expresses our commitment to being "Christ in our community" for ALL our neighbors.



*Book Discussion in February/March, 2019*

RLC members Marilyn Shardlow and Sara Mohn will lead discussions of the book "TheHateUGive" during the 10:10 hour on Sundays, February 26 and March 3rd, 2019. This recent bestseller by Angie Thomas focuses on the killing of a young black man by a police officer and its complex impact on his family, friends, and community. It has been widely read by young people across the country, so RLC youth are especially encouraged to participate, as well as others of any age. ## PROJECT HOME

### *Helping the Homeless in our Community*

When we think of homelessness and hunger, we often think of third-world countries, or areas where war or famine are taking place. But there is homelessness and hunger within our own community.

On any given evening in Minnesota, over 4,000 children experience homelessness, with nearly 50% of these being children under 5 years of age.

Please consider the following passage from the book of Matthew:

*“Then the righteous will answer him,  
‘Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you,  
or thirsty and give you something to drink?  
When did we see you a stranger and invite you in,  
or needing clothes and clothe you?*

*When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?’*

*“The King will reply, ‘Truly I tell you,  
whatever you did for one of the least of these  
brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.’*

– Matthew 25: 37-40 (NIV)

When Jesus speaks about ‘the least of these’, he isn’t saying that some people are better and some are lesser. He’s saying that some are in need, and others are in a position to help. As a faith community, we at Roseville Lutheran have been blessed with the ability to care for those among us who are in need.

In partnership with Project Home, a ministry run by the organization Interfaith Action, we can provide emergency shelter to homeless families in Ramsey County, and to lead them toward permanent housing.

This February will be the fifth year that Roseville Lutheran Church will participate in this ministry. Every evening of the month, our Cornerstone classrooms in ‘Ark Alley’ will become bedrooms for up to 20 of our neighbors who are experiencing homelessness.

Each evening they will arrive at RLC by bus and will be able to use the Heritage Hall as a gathering space, while also having a private room for each family to sleep.

There are many ways for you to be involved. We are looking for individuals of all ages – singles, couples and families – to spend the evening interacting with our guests from 5:30 to 8:30 pm. These folks will prepare and serve a light snack.

Another set of individuals are needed to stay overnight from 8:00 pm to 7:30 am, to be available in case of emergency. These folks will have cots with mattresses for sleeping. They will set out a light breakfast for our guests before they leave in the morning.

We will also need a move-in crew on the morning of February 1st to unload a truck with cots, mattresses, bedding and other supplies to support the needs of our guests. A move-out crew will be needed on the morning of March 1st to load these same items into a truck that will then head to the next faith community that will be hosting. And we will also be asking for donors to provide fresh fruit or homemade treats to have available for our guests.

## TANZANIAN SCHOLARSHIPS CONTINUE IN 2019

Recognizing the importance of education worldwide, RLC is continuing to provide scholarship support for students in Tanzania again in 2019. Many are members of RLC’s companion congregation in Ng’ang’ange, Tanzania, who are attending secondary schools in nearby villages. These students are chosen by the parish leaders in Ng’ang’ange, and each student receives scholarship support based on the cost of their particular school and their family’s ability to pay.

Scholarships are administered by the Bega Kwa Bega program of the St. Paul Area Synod in partnership with the Iringa Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania. A portion of RLC’s scholarship funds will also support some post-secondary students from the Iringa Diocese. Altogether, we anticipate that well over three dozen students will be able to continue their education with scholarship help from RLC. This important ministry helps fulfill RLC’s vision to be A Community United by Grace on a truly global scale.

Student scholarships are but one of several ways RLC is working together with the Ng’ang’ange parish to strengthen our mutual relationship in a global ministry of service and Christian love. RLC’s Mission and Outreach Ministry Team extends a sincere THANK YOU to everyone who gave a special scholarship contribution this fall. Your generosity will make our shared ministry possible for many worthy students throughout 2019. We continue to hold these young scholars in our prayers.


## HOLIDAY SOUP AND SOAP DRIVE FOR KEYSTONE
