• August 2022 Month-End Financial Summary and Statement of Operations are attached:



- o Total Receipts YTD are \$72,980 below budget.
- o Total Expenses YTD are \$27,553 below budget, meaning that we are \$45,427 below our expected budget position as of the end of August.
- Child Care and Preschool funds have been combined as of July 1st. With one full-time director managing both ministries, combining the funds streamlines operations and reporting.


<u>Youth & Family Committee</u> Thursday September 8th, 2022 - Zoom Prepared By: Nancy Brown
