WE ARE STILL DOING THE WORK OF THE CHURCH

Spiritual writer, poet and speaker, Phyllis Tickle once wrote in her book, Great Emergence: How Christianity is Changing and Why, that every 500 years the Church goes through a "rummage sale" so to speak, where it cleans out the old forms of spirituality and replaces it with new ones. She calls this time the "Great Emergence" and compares our time of this emergence to other "Greats" in the history of Christianity, including the Great Transformation (when God walked among us), to the time of Gregory the Great (500 A.D.), the Great Schism (1000 A.D.), and the Great Reformation (1500's A.D.)

Now, 500 years after the Great Reformation, we are entering a new era, a new religious movement that crosses denominational boundaries, seeks common ground, engages diverse cultures, embraces social causes as ways to live out Christ's call to serve others, and takes place largely outside of church buildings.

Written in 2012, Tickle would have had no idea how clearly her words would speak to the church during this time of the "Great Covid Crisis of 2020!"



Over the past months, our congregation has had to reform, reshape and reinvest in alternative ways of leading ministry, worship and fellowship. The church has been on a steep learning curve as we adapt how we approach ways of doing things, as well as discover new ministries all together.

Here at Roseville Lutheran Church, we have embraced the challenge we now find ourselves in. We are still "doing" church, but it is definitly NOT inside of the church building.

As your senior pastor, I encourage you to read through the pages of this publication and explore how the work of the church is taking shape in this new era and how we are having an impact on people both near and far as we continue to live out our mission and vision to "Love God. Love your neighbor. A community united by grace." Perhaps you will see a part of your own faith story reflected in these stories of giving, loving, serving and worshipping.

I also invite you to join us on our website and our Facebook page starting Sunday, May 10th to hear more about the amazing ways the Holy Spirit is engaging and leading us through this time and ask you to prayerfully consider the ways in which you can give financially to support our ongoing mission and ministry. RLC Care Ministry centers around our mission to "love God and neighbor." Our Care Team reaches out to members, the elderly, and sick, with regular calls, visits, rides, help with chores, and prayer. Our team has over two dozen servants and others who support this work.

Fellowship and Care has evolved! Over 300 meals were delivered to members/ friends of RLC with help from hospitality ministry in April. Small groups have made masks and delivered meals. More than 300 family units over the age of 70 have been contacted by volunteers.

Project Home families moved out on Monday, March 2, after being hosted in our building for the month of February. Many thanks to the volunteers, pastors, all staff, and to to Mission and Outreach for the support and encouragement. They say it takes a village. What a great village we've got!



Did you know that when you serve you not only measurably fill palpable needs in our community and world, you also grow personally. Serving those in need helps you to deepen understanding, humility and empathy for everyone, and respond with gratefulness for God's abundant gifts.

Mission and Outreach Ministry at Roseville Lutheran Church is deepening partnerships in our Roseville Community in 7 key areas. Through these partnerships people are fed, housed, mentored, and treated with both dignity and grace.

From Survival to Sustainability Feed My Starving Children

Fighting hunger is at the heart of several ministries at RLC. And while most of these efforts fight hunger in our area communities, we invite you to join us – or join us again – during this years pack on October 21-27 (NEW date!) to pack more than a million meals in support of our Minnesota partners who are successfully fighting child hunger throughout the world.

This is the sixth year of our partnership with Incarnation Lutheran Church and Minnesota-based Feed My Starving Children (FMSC), and it brings an exciting new challenge: This will be the first of a three-year commitment to fill an entire shipping container of Manna Packs (273,000 meals) to support Tè Wouj, a remote village in Haiti, so its families can redirect their energy and resources from survival to sustainability as they recover from a hurricane three years ago. Plus, we'll be helping pack 750,000 meals at the MobilePack to help FMSC and their global partners reduce the number of children who die each year from malnutrition or associated diseases.





In January our volunteers worked to provide hope to homes in Roseville. Here's what they accomplished: 130 blankets made/donated, 52 dressers built, 88 kitchen packs wrapped, and 50 cleaning kits assembled! We were thankful to have Wendy Erickson, volunteer coordinator from Bridging share a story of the impact on one family. A volunteer was helping find things they would need for their new home. When they got to the silverware, the daughter exclaimed "mom, we won't have to share a spoon anymore." The donations and work done to provide these essential household items to Bridging each year make an impact on families right here in Roseville!

I have learned so much through the special events offered to our community in the last 4 years through Our Neighbors and Me. ONAM's work is to challenge, educate and empower our congregation to explore issues of racial equity and social justice. I believe that having a justice mindset is one key way I practice my faith.

CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND FAMILY • May 13

The service events, Bible workshops, Lord's Prayer workshops and regular Sunday morning ministry helps our kids and youth grow in their faith. During this time when we cannot gather together to encourage one another, we can demonstrate kindness to our neighbor and God's love by helping in a variety of ways. RLC Preschool may have physically closed, but our teachers are working hard at connecting with our students through distance learning and have created mini-lesson videos on FB, YouTube, and a new service called Remind. Plus, they've gathered learning materials to give to our students at Drive-Thrus in our parking lot, being cautious of social distancing.

Our Childcare House is open to help parents who are classified as Emergency Workers. One parent commented, "Thank you for continuing to provide a safe place for our daughter to be as we sort through many unknowns with work and daily life as COVID-19 unfolds...we rest easier at night knowing our daughter is taken care of during the day."

Through bible study, small groups, support groups, men's breakfast, and adult education classes there are many opportunities each week to grow in love for God and neighbor.

Christina Johnson is a senior at Bethel University and has been volunteering with the Confirmation program and attending worship and Bible Study at RLC for the last three years. In March she was one of our young adult preachers during our Lenten Worship series on Wednesdays. In her sermon she talked about some of the ways that her faith has been shaped and about her calling to use her gifts to serve God's people. She said:

The Israelites are instructed to share the first fruits of their soil and offer it to the LORD. And then, I think a key part of this is what they are instructed to say as they bring the first fruits. They are told recite the story of their people. They remember the suffering and misery they experienced in Egypt and they remember that it is God who will have brought them out and into the had they had been promised.

I stand before you today as a survivor of my own desert. So I have asked myself, what are my first fruits to offer God? Well, they are my passion for confirmation age students, my ability to see myself in the story of another and extend empathy, my

comfort in the silence and in the pain, and my value in choosing purposeful words and none extra. So, I live my life as I do, at church, with the youth, studying practical theology and psychology, because this is how I use the first fruits, the gifts God has given me to honor God and love my neighbor.

We are so grateful for the ways that Christina has grown and served during her time in college and in the community of faith at Roseville Lutheran Church.





In 2018 I suffered lower back pain and was nervous and uncertain regarding surgery. I was in need of prayers. I searched for a support group and attended the men's Bible Study group at RLC.
